

While demonstrating confidence and control the **TEAM** must successfully complete all requirements. This testing involves the AKC Canine Good Citizen test as well as The Touch of Healing with the additional requirements *in bold Italics*.

TEST 1: ACCEPTING A FRIENDLY STRANGER

This test demonstrates that the dog will allow a friendly stranger to approach it and speak to the handler in a natural, everyday situation. The Evaluator and handler shake hands and exchange pleasantries. The dog must show no sign of resentment or shyness, and must not break position or try to go to the Evaluator.

TEST 2: SITTING POLITELY FOR PETTING

This test demonstrates that the dog will allow a friendly stranger to touch it while it is out with its handler. The dog should sit at the handler's side as the Evaluator approaches and begins to pet the dog on the head and body only. The dog may stand in place to accept petting. The dog must not show shyness or resentment. *In addition, three people will approach dog at once for petting and one person will hug dog.*

TEST 3: APPEARANCE AND GROOMING

This practical test demonstrates that the dog will welcome being groomed and examined and will permit a stranger, such as a veterinarian, groomer or friend of the owner, to do so. It also demonstrates the owner's care, concern and sense of responsibility. The Evaluator inspects the dog, then combs or brushes the dog, and lightly examines the ears and each front foot. *In addition the face and tail will be touched.*

TEST 4: OUT FOR A WALK

(WALKING ON A LOOSE LEASH)

This test demonstrates that the handler is in control of the dog. The dog can be on either side of the handler, whichever the handler prefers. There must be a left turn, a right turn and an about turn with at least one stop in between and another at the end. The dog need not be perfectly aligned with the handler and need not sit when the handler stops. *In addition, food and toys will be present on floor during the walk.*

TEST 5: WALKING THROUGH A CROWD

This test demonstrates that the dog can move about politely in pedestrian traffic and is under control in public places. The dog and handler walk around and pass close to several people (at least three). The dog may show some interest in the strangers, without appearing over exuberant, shy, or resentful. The handler may talk to the dog and encourage or praise the dog throughout the test. The dog should not be straining at the leash. *In addition, other distractions will be present.*

TEST 6: SIT/DOWN ON COMMAND/ STAYING IN

PLACE

This test demonstrates that the dog has training, will respond to the handler's command to sit and down, and will remain in the place commanded by the handler (sit or down position, whichever the handler prefers). The handler may take a reasonable amount of time and use more than one command to make the dog sit and then down. When instructed by the Evaluator, the handler tells the dog to stay and walks forward the length of a 20-foot line. The dog must remain in place, but may change positions. *The dog will be required to sit between 2 other dogs.*

TEST 7: COMING WHEN CALLED

This test demonstrates that the dog will come when called by the handler. The handler will walk 10 feet from the dog; turn to face the dog, and call the dog. The handler may use encouragement to get the dog to come. Handlers may choose to tell the dog to "stay" or "wait," or they may simply walk away, giving no instructions to the dog as the Evaluator provides mild distraction (e.g., petting).

TEST 8: REACTION TO ANOTHER DOG

This test demonstrates that the dog can behave politely around other dogs. Two handlers and their dogs approach each other from a distance of about 10 yards, stop, shake hands, and exchange pleasantries, and continue on for about 5 yards. The dogs should show no more than a casual interest in each other.

TEST 9: REACTIONS TO DISTRACTIONS

This test demonstrates that the dog is confident at all times when faced with common distracting situations, such as the dropping of a large book or a jogger running in front of the dog. The dog may express a natural interest and curiosity and/or appear slightly startled, but should not panic, try to run away, show aggressiveness or bark.

TEST 10: SUPERVISED SEPARATION

This test demonstrates that a dog can be left with a trusted person, if necessary, and will maintain its training and good manners. Evaluators are encouraged to say something like, "Would you like me to watch your dog?" and then take hold of the dog's leash. The owner will go out of sight for three minutes. The dog does not have to stay in position but should not continually bark, whine, or pace unnecessarily, or show anything stronger than mild agitation or nervousness.

THE VISIT

The dog will be assessed on whether or not the dog willingly goes to visit a stranger.

Additional Information for testing:

- *Dogs should be 1 year of age at testing.*
- *Dogs should be clean, free from odor, not in season, in good health, which includes: being an appropriate weight, able to move easily, free from obvious infections or irritations of skin, ears, mouth or anything else that may be considered unpleasant.*
- *All Dogs should wear a well fitting buckle collar or a non-corrective harness and the leash should be nylon, cloth, or leather. **NO** chain leashes or Flexi-leads.*
- *The owner should bring a brush for the dog.*
- *A 20-foot lead will be supplied for recalls and stays--if needed.*
- *Owners are highly encouraged to use praise throughout the test. Treats or toys are not allowed to be used during testing.*
- *Any dog that demonstrates aggression toward a person or a dog before, during, or after testing, will be dismissed and no monies refunded.*
- *Any dog that eliminates during the test will be dismissed and no monies refunded.*
- *The dogs will be tested around medical equipment and people who are noisy (yelling, coughing, moaning etc.) or who are moving erratically (limping, dragging, feet, moving quickly, etc.).*
- *There will be distractions such as food, toys, other dogs, noises (i.e. whistling, banging, squeaking equipment) worked into the test especially at numbers 2,5,6,7, & 9.*
- *The dogs will be expected to know a leave-it command in order to navigate around the distractions presented during testing.*

PROOF OF CURRENT VACINATION IS REQUIRED at time of testing.
